Indonesian Association of Plastic Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons (InaPRAS)

History of Plastic Surgery in Indonesia

The practice of plastic surgery in Indonesia began with the entry of medical science from the Western countries. Initially, plastic surgery was intended for repairs for war victims who suffered burns. The knowledge of plastic surgery procedures was brought by Austro-Hungarian surgeons who lived in the Dutch East Indies. These experts came to Indonesia as they joined the Army Medical Corps after World War I. They performed surgery on war victims. Generally, the cases encountered at that time were facial damage, cleft lips, burns, and skin cancer.

The plastic surgery in Indonesia was initially developed by Professor Moenadjat Wiraatmadja. He graduated as a surgeon from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Indonesia (FKUI) in 1958.

Moenadjat Wiraatmadja continued his education to be plastic surgeon at the University of Washington and Barnes Hospital in the United States until 1959. By the time he returned to Indonesia, Professor Moenadjat began to dedicate his knowledge to service and educate of medical students and surgical training participants at FKUI and Cipto Mangunkusumo Hospital.

Surgical trainees accepted under his guidance were surgeons who graduated from FKUI. Staffs from the Department of Surgery were the main priority to be accepted as trainees and undergone two-year compulsory education in plastic surgery to become plastic surgeon. The first general surgeon who was appointed as a trainee was dr. Bisono. He completed his plastic surgery education in 1971, followed by dr. Sidik Setiamihardja in 1974. They both became staff of the Plastic Surgery division of RSCM-FKUI under Prof. Moenadjat.

The plastic surgery training program of University of Indonesia was officially established in 1989 with Decree No. 107/DIKTI/Kep/1989 on November 13, 1989 by the Director General of Higher Education, Sukadji Ranuwihardjo. Based on the Decree, on January 1st 1990 this training program began to organize integrated education and learning activities combined with plastic surgery medical services for patients.

Currently, there are five plastic surgery reconstructive and aesthetic training programs in Indonesia. All of these program are university-based education, organized by the University of Indonesia, Airlangga University, Padjadjaran University, Udayana University, and Syiah Kuala University.

Indonesian Association of Plastic Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons

Indonesian Plastic Surgeons Association (PERAPI/InaPRAS) was founded on November 8th, 1980 by 11 founders and Dr. Sidik Setiamihardja was appointed as the first President. Since that time, InaPRAS has increase its size in number and have 331 members this year. InaPRAS is divided into 8 regions based on gegographical location.

InaPRAS is dedicated to host annual meetings once a year and also sponsored some scientific seminars held by local regions. Not only Indonesian plastic surgeons, the meeting usually attended by international speakers and guests. In conjunction with the scientific annual meeting, InaPRAS certifies those who graduated the examinations as Board Certified of Plastic Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons.

As an active association, to broaden our network and to improve our knowledge and skill, InaPRAS has developed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with several international associations such as, American Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS), Asian Federation of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery Societies (APRAS), Taiwan Society od Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (TSAPS), Korean Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons (KSPRS), Korean Society for Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (KSAPS), Malaysian Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery (MSPRS) and Russian Society of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons (RSPRAS). InaPRAS is registered as a member of ICOPLAST as well.
